Big Question: Do our choices matter?

The Two Plots

- Do our choices matter? Yes, but not in the way you think.
- God only wrote two plots.
- Tragedy: “He became great, but then he fell.”
- Comedy: “Things were bad, but then they got better.”
- *Genesis 13:8–9* “If you take the left hand, then I will go to the right, or if you take the right hand, then I will go to the left.”

Lot’s Choice

- *Genesis 13:10–11* “Lot ... saw that the Jordan Valley was well watered everywhere like the garden of the Lord ... Lot chose for himself all the Jordan Valley”
- Lot chose to make himself great.
- *Genesis 13:13* “The men of Sodom were wicked, great sinners against the Lord.”
- *Genesis 14:11–12* “So the enemy took all the possessions of Sodom and Gomorrah ... They also took Lot ... who was dwelling in Sodom, and his possessions”
- Lot choice led him into the world of tyrants and violence.
- *Genesis 19:24* “Then the Lord rained on Sodom and Gomorrah sulfur and fire”

Abram’s Choice

- *Genesis 13:12* “Abram settled in the land of Canaan”
- Abram chose not to make himself great.
- *Genesis 13:14–15* “all the land that you see I will give to you”
- Abram took none, so God gave him all.
- *Genesis 14:14–16* “Abram heard that his kinsman had been taken captive ... And he divided his forces against them by night, he and his servants, and defeated them”
- God made Abram an instrument of blessing and rescue.
- *Genesis 14:18–20* “Melchizedek king of Salem ... blessed him and said, ‘Blessed be Abram by God Most High, Possessor of heaven and earth’”
- Instead of tyrants and violence, Abram was blessed by a priest.

The Gospel Plot

- *Hebrews 5:5–6* “So also Christ did not exalt himself to be made a high priest”
- *Hebrews 5:8–9* “he learned obedience through what he suffered. And being made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation to all who obey him.”
- Jesus knows this story. Jesus lived this story. Jesus blesses this story.
